We concentrate on physical stream reclamation and restoration projects, public water access and youth education with outdoor experience opportunities.

Time: Thousands of volunteer hours are logged each year

Manual Labor: Five in-stream habitat improvement projects were held in the spring and summer of 2021 plus an average of 4-5 per year for the past several years (two in 2020).

Youth education:

- Kid's Fishing Day with disadvantaged youth for over 20 years
- Take-a-Kid-Fishing Day for several years
- Currently we have three schools operating Trout-in-the-Classroom programs (Lombardi Middle School, Bay View Middle School and Pulaski HS)
