Manual Labor: Five in-stream habitat improvement projects were held in the spring and summer of 2024 plus an average of 4-5 per year for the past several years.

- Kid's Fishing Day w/ disadvantaged youth for over 30 years (w/ the PALS program)
- Worked with OCC Take-a-Kid-Fishing Day for several years
- Volunteered with OCC Women's Outdoor Workshop for many years
- Completed Trout "Tails" Educational Trail revamp (across from the N.E.W. Zoo)
